# **Reconciliation Service**

On Thursday, as part of our Lenten preparations for Easter the children of Years 4, 5 and 6 participated in simple class-based services of reconciliation here in school. Each service was led by Father Paul supported by Father Tom Goonan from St Oswald's parish. Every child was given the opportunity to speak to Father Paul or Father Tom and to receive the Sacrament of Confession if eligible. The services were very simple and special and were conducted in an appropriately prayerful manner. I would like to thank Father Paul and Father Tom for supporting us; Mrs Humphries for coordinating the services and the children themselves for engaging so brilliantly.

## **Read Write Inc**
