Update

Information is still being shared by the government and the latest model for a September risk assessment has just been released. We also expect some further guidance to be released towards the end of the summer holiday when the government has a clearer idea of how the COVID-19 pandemic is progressing. We will release a revised plan before school starts which will detail all the arrangements for the children's return.

September 2020: The First Days

A reminder that when the children first return in September they will be returning to this year's classroom so that they can spend their first three days with this year's class teacher. In doing this our aim is to help our children reconnect with school and each other as gently as possible, which we think will be particularly important for those who have not attended since lockdown.

We know that everyone's experience of lockdown, and the period of easing that has followed, has been very different. Some of you, thankfully, have been largely unaffected. For a number of you however, the experience has been challenging in many different ways.

At SJF the wellbeing of all members of our community remains a key priority for me, and so as a team of staff and Governors, we want to be ready to support each every child who needs it - and their families. Therefore, during the first three days there will be a huge focus on pupil wellbeing for everyone. Any children requiring additional support will also be picked up. The support offered will continue for as long as it is needed.

In order to target the right children with the support they need we will use the feedback from pupil and parents/carers surveys. We will also use the intelligence we gather from observing and listening to the children. Parents/carers can support us by getting in touch if they feel their children have struggled (or are struggling) in any way, especially if anything has happened recently, since the surveys were sent out. We hope that it will be possible to welcome back our Y6 leavers during the in the autumn term so that they can catch up with each other and staff for a very *much* delayed last day. If it is possible to go ahead the children will be invited bring an old SJF school shirt with them to get signed. Even though leavers' events that we had planned cannot go ahead as we hoped, we will do all we can to make things as special as possible.
