She has worked tirelessly to ensure that this lengthy – and at times challenging - process has run smoothly and we are all very grateful.

In 1992 it was time to come home. By now our children had grown up and married and presented us with three grandchildren, two of whom attended St John Fisher school. I managed to find a job in Sheffield as a maintenance engineer in a shopping mall. This was a culture shock in reverse! From a land where women are rarely seen and never heard, my first day at Meadowhall was an eye opener! When I got home my wife laughed.

I'm now retired and hopefully, along with other Governors can help our school go forward, indeed it already is.
