### The Visit of Bishop John: New Date

The visit of Bishop John Rawsthorne will *not* now take place on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> December 2013. Instead it has been rearranged for **Monday 20<sup>th</sup> January 2014**.

The timetable will be the same on that day, so you are all invited to a simple liturgy which will start at 2.30pm in the hall. I am very grateful to our PTFA who will provide refreshments after the liturgy, giving you an opportunity to meet Bishop John and our other guests, which will include Fr Paul, Governors, our partners from the Diocese of Hallam, the architect and the main contractor as well as the PTFA committee.

#### New Curriculum

Since September we have been developing a new curriculum partly in response to the Ofsted judgement last July and partly to meet the requirements of the new Primary National Curriculum being which comes into force in September 2014. We are working with a highly regarded consultant educationalist called Jane Pow who also works currently as part of a group of experts advising the Department of Education.

As a staff we have spent a great deal of time thinking about the sort of curriculum we need for St John Fisher; the sort of exciting curriculum our children deserve; one that will help us drive up standards and keep them high.

Our aim is that our new curriculum will excite and engage all our children. We want it to be rigorous; with a big focus on the teaching and learning of those important basic skills that our children need to in order to make progress and fulfil their potential. I want my colleagues to take full advantage of the freedoms that our new curriculum will offer to ensure that deep learning takes place and our children enjoy, achieve so they can be the best they can be.

Every day children will have a 'Number and Calculation' session which will focus on meeting every child's needs so they build confidence with numbers, sequencing and completing calculations (mentally and using informal and formal written strategies). We aim to deliver parent/carer workshops to demonstrate what is being taught in school so you feel more confident supporting your children at home.

Children will also have focused sessions to develop reading, handwriting, spelling and their understanding of punctuation and grammar which will again aim to address any barriers holding them back. We want our curriculum to empower every child so that he/she makes at least 'good' progress from their different starting points.

All other areas of mathematics along with the different subjects of the National Curriculum, including computing and science, will be taught in a cross-curricular way when appropriate or as specific modules within themes. PE will continue to be led by specialist sports coaches.

The themes will be whole-school and in January we will pilot our first, entitled "Marvellous Machines". You will receive a Curriculum Overview explaining what will be covered soon after we return. I would very much appreciate your feedback and ideas so that we can get it right for our children. Thank you.

This means that once our school is in a secure position he will spend some of his time working to support colleagues and promote outstanding practice in other schools.
