<u>Transition: St John Fisher</u>

We understand fully that deciding which primary school is right for their children is a huge decision for all parents and carers. It is for this reason that we are sad that things had to be so different for our current FS2 children when they were applying to join us last year.

Normally before our new FS2 children start school, I meet them with their parents/carers to talk about the school and show them around, answering any questions that they might have. It gives them an opportunity to see what school is like on a normal day so that they can get a real sense of what we are about and how our day-to-day operation is shaped by our Catholic ethos and values.









We then see a number of prospective parents/carers at our annual Open Morning, which is also a wonderful opportunity for them to meet staff, Governors, PTFA members and the pupils, who act as tour guides showing our guests around the building whilst sharing their perspectives on SJF school life. They also answer any questions that our guests might have.

The new children who go on to receive places, are then visited both at home (with their parents/carers) and at their pre-school setting, by my FS2 colleagues, who aim to gather as much information as possible so that we already have quite a good understanding of each child by the time they start school. Obviously, for children and families where there are additional issues, a more tailored approach might be required, involving additional visits and meetings, depending on what the issues are.

In normal years our new FS2 pupils would then invited in to school for at least two 'taster' school experiences before finally joining us in September. Parents/carers would also be invited in for two special welcome meetings; one in the summer before their children start and one a few weeks in to the new term, after their children have started, so that we can share information and keep them up-to-date. It is also an opportunity for parents/carers to offer feedback and ask questions.

Currently, the restrictions that prevent or limit so much of what we would like to do, are still in place. We were informed by our local authority yesterday that new guidance from the government and Department for Education (DfE) is expected, and should be aligned to the government's roadmap. We have been assured that if this is not published in time then Sheffield and the other local authorities across England will provide schools with guidance on transition matters instead.

Primary schools have been cautioned to be patient by both the local and public health authorities, and told not to develop plans until official guidance is shared. It is important that there is consistency and that plans do not breach the law or put anyone at risk. As a consequence, we do not yet know what we will be allowed to do at this stage. However, as soon as there is clarity we will publish plans, and do as much as we can to ensure that the transition experience of our new children is as close to our usual offering as possible.

SJF Moving Up Day

The final decision about our internal moving up day will be made once guidance has been published. Our plan will then be shared shortly afterwards. Thank you.

Transition: All Saints Catholic High School

Letters have already been sent to parents/carers of Y6 children transferring to All Saints Catholic High School in September 2021, notifying them about transition day planned for **Wednesday 7th July 2021**.

The All Saints transition team have also been busy visiting feeder schools to talk to staff and to meet the children who will be joining the school in September. They have talked about the school and what will happen and made time to answer the children's questions.

As well as the transition day the transition team has also planned an optional summer school for those transferring in September. It will run Monday 9th August to Friday 13th of August 2021 and will be open to <u>all</u> eligible Y6 pupils who would like to attend.

Our Books of the Week!


For Our Younger Children
