Assessments

Statutory Assessments (SATs)

Well done to all our Y6 children who have now completed their statutory assessments. I would like to thank Mr MacInness and Mrs Walton for all their hard work leading up to the assessments and throughout the week. Thank you to all those who provided the special breakfast each morning too; including, Mrs Ramsden, Miss Birch and Mrs Gregory. Everyone worked hard make the week positive and happy for all our Y6 children.

Y6 writing assessments continue and it has now been confirmed that our Y6 writing will be moderated formally by the local authority. A reminder that the children in Y2 continue to face statutory assessments and the young people of Y1 will undergo phonics testing (as part of national screening) at the beinning of June, along with those Y2 pupils who did not meet the national phonics standard last year.

Assessment Point 3

The final round of internal assessments take place for children in Years 1, 3, 4 and 5 next week. The outcomes of these and the statutory tests faced by Y2/Y6 pupils will be shared in the final reports of the school year.

Attendance


Attendance is especially important at this time. We continue to work very hard to support children, including those who have been most hampered by the lockdowns and pandemic, so that they can all reach their potential. Good attendance really supports us, and this process. Poor attendance holds the children back.

There is now a huge national focus on improving pupils' attendance. The government published two lengthy documents, recently, focused on this very issue. The local authority is also working closely with Sheffield schools. This week we were visited by an attendance officer to discuss our pupils' attendance. She asked for a breakdown of data. Where attendance is low, the aim will be to understand the issues and to offer the support and advice families need so the issues can be addressed. Parents/carers can also contact Mr Smith, at any time, if they feel that their children's attendance is becoming an issue and they want our help.





From the joys of the seaside to the miseries of the sickbed, this exuberant volume captures to perfection the world of childhood.








