Maths at SJF

Curriculum

As many of you will have heard from the class teachers already this year, there have been significant changes to the National Curriculum recently and these changes will be tested at the end of Year 2 and Year 6 for the first time this year.

As a school, we have wasted no time in adopting the new 'mastery' approach to teaching maths from this year. This is the approach that is already used in those highest performing countries of the world where mathematics is a real strength, and is key part of the UK government's education reforms.



The 'mastery' approach involves teaching maths in such a way that every child can develop a deep understanding. Physical resources and pictorial representations are used as much as possible throughout school so that children can 'see' and 'feel' the maths and there is an emphasis on understanding and explaining rather than just learning procedures and facts.

The approach is based on the belief that <u>all</u> pupils are capable of understanding and doing mathematics, given sufficient time, the appropriate on-going support and the right challenge.

This year, all children in a class will always work on the same topics together, with additional challenge being provided for every pupil by going deeper rather than just accelerating on through to new content. Further information about this will be provided throughout the year and if you have any questions please do not hesitate to get in touch with us.
