Parking Incident

Unfortunately there was a disagreement between parents/carers about parking around school which led to an incident that required the police to attend. What was particularly sad was that this incident was witnessed by a number of children and their families as they left school.

It was also witnessed by local residents - some of whom contacted us afterwards to express their shock and disgust and to complain about their own parking-related issues e.g. grass verges being churned up or their driveways/garages being blocked by vehicles parked inconsiderately.

I would like to remind you all of the importance of parking safely and considerately around school. The restrictions now in place were redesigned and implemented by the local authority because they were what the experts deemed necessary in order to ensure the safety of our children and their families. I am confident that you would all agree that the safety of our children is the most important consideration at all times.

I therefore appeal to you to please park safely and considerately every day. Don't be the reason that an accident occurs because your vehicle is parked illegally – even if it is just for a short time whilst you 'nip in'.

If you are concerned about unsafe or inconsiderate parking I would ask that you complain to the Police and local authority directly and calmly, though I am also happy to pass on complaints emailed to me.

As a school community we are relying on you all to park safely and to not upset the local residents needlessly. So please, if you cannot park close to school *legally*, then don't. Just park a little further away and walk.

Please note that you are <u>not</u> allowed to park on the pavement in front of school either.

To park safely or illegally is a choice and we all hope that you make the right one – every day. Thank you.

On 11th of November we all came together for our annual Community Service of Remembrance at Our Lady of Lourdes church. It was a beautifully simple service led by the young people of Y6 which culminated in the presentation of wreaths of individual poppies which had been decorated by the children and the playing of 'The Last Post'. I would like to thank the Y6 pupils and my colleagues. It meant a lot that so many of you were also able to join and support us in order to mark this important day in the life of our school and our nation.



Lunchtime Routine and Top Table

Earlier today I met with the Student Councillors to go over details of changes that are being made to the lunchtime routine and to answer their questions. The decision to change the lunchtime routine was made after careful consideration was given to feedback and ideas from the pupils and some parents. In making these changes it is hoped that none of the *positives* from the 'family' approach will be lost whilst the issues over waiting times and shortened play times, felt most keenly by our older children, will be addressed.

From Monday 16th November there will now be **two** lunchtime sittings. The youngest children in FS2 and Years 1 and 2 will start their one hour lunch break at 11.45am in the hall with a shared 'Grace before Meals' prayer - as we do currently. They will also sit in new 'families', which will include more children from their own classes. They will then be served their food straightaway.

For the children in Years 3-6 (Key Stage 2), lunchtime will start at 12.10pm (for a trial period) and also last for an hour. Having recited the 'Grace before Meals' prayer in class the older children will walk into the hall and go straight to their places; joining new Key Stage 2 'families' made up of more friends and children from their own classes. By the time they arrive all the younger children should have been served their lunches enabling them to also start going up for food straightaway.

We are hopeful that this will eradicate/limit delays and mean that the older children will have more play time after they have eaten. We will monitor it closely and if we notice that the younger children do not need all the time allotted for them to be served their meals we will think about starting the Key Stage 2 lunchtime earlier than 12.10pm.

This week the family chosen to sit on the 'Top Table' was the Swallow family! Congratulations to you all!


<u>Head Lice</u>


