We have managed to feed and help 26 children! That is an amazing **£320** raised for charity! Once again, we would like to thank you very much for your generosity and for everything you have donated.




Holocaust Memorial Day

The young people of Y6 had an amazing day at the Beth Shalom Holocaust Centre last Friday. We followed the journey of a young Jewish boy living in Berlin just before World War II started and found out a bit about what it was like to be a Jewish person at that time.

In the afternoon, we had the privilege of listening to and asking questions of a Jewish survivor of the Holocaust who is now living in England. He was an amazing man and the story of his experiences, including being in concentration camps as a small boy was incredibly powerful. The Year 6 children have done some fantastic writing about leaving home as a follow-up to this day.
