The Decorated Egg Competition


I would like to thank everyone who entered this year's competition organised by the PTFA. Each year group had a different theme and standard was incredible, as you can see...

Statement to Live By

Next week our 'statement to live by' is "I know it is ok for me to make mistake."

Time to talk: Together you could explore how you feel about making mistakes. Is making mistakes a negative thing? Something to be feared or avoided at all costs? How can mistakes help us - to learn and grow? Why is having a healthy attitude to making mistakes important? Making mistakes as we learn is a crucial part of the learning process and is therefore unavoidable. It is certainly nothing to be feared.
