Exciting Developments

Over the holidays work started on the development of our new wildlife area, with the pond being dug. The wooden fence that surrounded the FS2 outdoor area, has been replaced with a new one and those sections of that wooden fence that can be, will be repurposed to surround the new wildlife area. We are working closely with our PTFA and the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust on this exciting project. Once complete the area will be used in a range of ways to support local wildlife and develop our children's knowledge, skills and wellbeing.



We will be looking to recruit volunteers to work with our Eco Team members to maintain the area once it is complete. All volunteers will be subject to ongoing safeguarding checks in line with best practice. There has also been a significant investment in new resources to further support the learning of our FS2 children in the outdoors. These items will be introduced/installed in the coming days.

Good attendance does not just support learning and achievement, it also protects children's wellbeing. Children tell us, themselves, that absence from school makes them feel anxious because they worry about missing learning and falling behind. They also worry about friends moving on whilst they are away from school.

We know that there will be times when absence is unavoidable, e.g. because of sickness, and so we always work very hard to help children settle back in. We are also very grateful when unnecessary absences are avoided, for example, term-time holidays and when medical/dental appointments are made after school, during school holidays or at the end of a school day if there is an option to do so. Doing these simple things really helps support children's learning, development and connections with peers.
