School Letter Box

If you have notes and letters that you would like to pass to our administrative staff you might find it quicker to use the post box in the entrance foyer if you do not also need to speak to anyone.

Free School Meals

If you are in receipt of benefits and/or you income and family circumstances have changed you might find that you are entitled to apply for free school meals for your child(ren).

School systems and processes protect the privacy of all children who are entitled to free school meals so that their experience is no different to that of others. Children do not know who is and who is not entitled to free school meals.

All children in FS2 and Years 1 and 2 receive free school meals under a government scheme called 'Universal Infant Free School Meals' regardless of their family circumstances. However, it is <u>very</u> important that you inform us if you are a low income family and/or in receipt of benefits as we can also apply for a significant pupil premium grant for your child. This is not provided automatically, we have to apply.
