School Review

On Monday we will be visited by Mr Jamie Kilner who is working on behalf of the Diocese to review the performance of all schools in the Diocese as part of an ongoing rolling programme. Mr Kilner is an Ofsted inspector who is familiar with our community having visited us many times over the past four years.

Interim Pupil Reports

You should all have received pupil progress and achievement updates which relate to the outcomes of assessments completed by the children in December. At St John Fisher we aim to share updates after each assessment point as well as an annual end of year report so that you know exactly how your children are doing throughout the year, and what their individual targets and priorities are.

As you may know the previous national system of 'Levels', which many parents and carers had become familiar with, was removed and schools were instead tasked with introducing their own tracking systems. We invited parents and carers to help us develop a format as part of a Focus Group. However as this was a couple of years ago we would like to invite everyone to a **workshop** to bring you up-to-date about assessment and share information about our tracking system and report formats.

There will be two workshops on **Monday 13th February 2017**. The first will be straight after school at **3.30pm** and this will be repeated at **5.00pm**. Both workshops will take place in Mr Smith's Y6 classroom.

Please note that we will also be able to provide childcare during the first session. Thank you.


