Staff and Parish Car Parks

I would very much appreciate your cooperation with this matter.

Term Dates 2017/18

I am aware that there has been some discussion about the 2017/18 term dates I issued on the 25th January. I thought it would be helpful to give you some background to the reason for these dates.

The Sheffield Local Authority is very keen for all schools to align their holiday patterns where possible. I therefore attended an open meeting with Headteachers from different Infant, Junior, Primary, Secondary and Special schools from right across Sheffield. Everyone had an opportunity to share their issues and ideas.

So you are clear, the Bishop's view is that Catholic schools should always aim to be open right up to the great feasts of Christmas and Easter and then have their holiday afterwards. We are therefore committed to trying to set SJF holidays based on this key principle.

I also wanted to respond to the reasonable feedback from parents/carers who have children in more than one setting and who have expressed their preference for term dates and holidays to be more aligned in order to make issues like holiday childcare and the booking of family holidays easier for them.

We have aligned our term dates with other Sheffield schools in 2017/18 because the dates proposed take account of the Catholic principle of working right up to the great feasts. I do appreciate that some of you might be disappointed that we do not have a two-week Spring Bank holiday in 2017/18 but this is because the Spring Bank Holiday coincides with the public examination season for secondary schools and colleges, meaning that they can never have a two-week holiday at this time.

As Easter is not fixed there may be specific years in the future where the full alignment of term dates between all Sheffield schools is more difficult than it is in 2017/18. However Headteachers and the Local Authority are committed to working together so that where possible term dates and holidays are aligned.

Uniform Reminder

Boots

Children can wear wellington boots or other high boots to and from school and at playtimes if the weather is cold and/or bad, however they must bring proper school shoes in with them to wear in school at all other times. Shoes can be left in a bag on their pegs after they change into their boots at the end of the day.

PE Kit

Children must wear a plain burgundy sweatshirt and plain grey jogging bottoms on PE days.
