
# St Andrew's Feast Day & Blue Day

## Monitoring of the Catholic Life of the School and Religious Education

In last week's newsletter I reported that we again had welcomed Mr Alan Dewhurst from the Diocese of Hallam so that he could carry out a monitoring visit to check that school was continuing to move forward following the award of 'Outstanding' judgments in our formal Section 48 inspection last December. His letter will be sent out with this newsletter.

Mrs Dewhurst observed that: "...the high standards observed at the time of the inspection are obviously being maintained thanks to the prominence of RE in the curriculum and staff enthusiasm in delivering high quality teaching."

At the end of the letter Mr Dewhurst concludes: "As a result of the review it is recommended that the school be congratulated on their commitment and enthusiasm, and be affirmed in the knowledge of the excellent witness they are passing on to their pupils. The school is well placed to continue to develop as a Catholic learning community, and is recommended to keep its strong sense of creativity, enthusiasm, imagination an innovation in carrying out its Catholic mission as it goes forward."

I would like to recognise the hard work and dedication of all my colleagues and especially Mrs Holloway who led RE until July 2017 and Mrs Barrett who has led RE since. I would also like to recognise the contribution of Governors, and especially Mrs Walton, the RE Link-Governor as well as Father Paul for their constant support.
