Mrs Asquith

Mrs Asquith leaves us after six years' service ultimately to pursue new opportunities in healthcare and in the shorter-term to care for and support her mother, who is very ill and her elderly father.

During her time with us Mrs Asquith has supported so many children and families with short, medium and longer-term issues. She has organised various parent/carer workshops and support programmes and has developed strong links with our multi-agency partners including the School Health Service, Social Care and MAST.

As Learning Mentor, Teaching Assistant and Staff Governor Mrs Asquith has been very active. She has also been a keen advocate for our Catholic life; responsible for the wonderful displays in our Sacred Space and around school created to mark the different seasons of the liturgical year and Sacramental events involving our children e.g. Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. As a staff, we take time to pray and reflect together regularly each week, and Mrs Asquith always contributed so positively during these important times.

A review of our inclusion and special educational needs provision was a priority for me when I joined our community in September 2012. Together with Mrs Asquith and Miss Kiernan an ambitious vision was set to make both inclusion and the provision for special educational needs and disabilities both strengths of the school. This included the establishment of a new and high quality dedicated learning area, which we now have ('The Ark'). The quality and impact of our provision has been recognised as a strength by OFSTED; the Diocese in the RE inspection; the local authority and our multi-agency partners; and - most importantly - by the children and families who have benefited most from our support.

Though a huge team effort, Mrs Asquith's contribution was significant, and this is part of the gift she leaves SJF. We owe her a huge debt of gratitude for her belief, focus, determination and resilience. Her rich legacy includes all the lives transformed for the better because of her, and the patience, love and care she has shown.

Miss Kiernan

Miss Kiernan has been instrumental in developing our strategies for safeguarding, inclusion and special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). She has worked tirelessly to ensure that our provision is effective. As a class teacher too she has worked hard across Key stages 1 and 2 to ensure that the children in her care have the best opportunities. As part of my leadership team she has been brave, loyal and so key to our journey.

Miss Kiernan has always been keen to focus more on the inclusion/SEND aspects of her role, and an opportunity arose for her to do this. Unfortunately it is elsewhere. Opportunities like this are very rare in primary schools and it was simply too good an opportunity for her miss. The Governors and I understand this and have been working on a solution that will enable Miss Kiernan to pursue her ambitions without disadvantaging our school. Miss Kiernan will therefore continue to lead inclusion/SEND as part of the leadership team until Christmas. This will give us time to implement a full transition to her eventual successor. A key priority is, of course, to maintain the level of care and support in place for all vulnerable children (and their families).

Mrs Barrett

Mrs Barrett is so excited to be joining the community in September as our new Deputy Headteacher and Y3 teacher (working alongside Mr Hawley). She is a highly experienced teacher who has worked extensively in the Catholic sector; and for the last 16 years or so, at Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School in Hillsborough. She brings with her a wealth of experience and ideas and very much looks forward to being part of the team.

Mrs Morris

Mrs Morris joins our Y1 Teaching and Learning Team, working as job-share with Mrs Sambrook on Thursdays and Fridays. Mrs Morris is a highly experienced teacher who has worked in all phases of primary education and has held a range of coordinator roles in school. Her greatest experience has been gained FS2 and Y1. She has already met the children and staff several times and she also looks forward to meeting everyone.

Mrs Pickering

Mrs Pickering has taken over as Learning Mentor from Mrs Asquith and is available to support children and families on a wide-range of issues, including attendance, safeguarding, pupil wellbeing, learning and behaviour.

Attendance Golden Time


Congratulations to the children of **Y4** who had the best attendance in Term 6! They earned 'Golden Time' on the last day, and enjoyed an extended playtime.

The Local Authority and MAST team who monitor attendance have asked us to inform families that in order for your child to receive an attendance mark s/he must be in school for at least one hour after the register has been taken. If s/he leaves school within the hour we have to remove the 'present' mark and replace it with an appropriate absence code.

Therefore, if a child leaves for an appointment within an hour of getting marked in the register as present MAST expect us to amend your child's mark to 'absent' for session(s) missed.

Earrings


