Staff & Governor News

I am delighted to welcome **Mr Shepherd** who is our new Y3 teacher, **Mr MacInnes** who is our new Y5 teacher and **Madame Crompton** who will be teaching French to children in Key Stage 2 (Years 3-6). We also welcome **Mr Blantern**, a trainee teacher on an initial teacher training programme run by our Sheffield Catholic Teaching Schools! He will be based in Y2 with Mrs Broadhead for the majority of the year, except for when he is on placement in another school.

We also welcome back **Mr Cross**, our PE Apprentice, in partnership with Sheffield College, who will be supporting the teaching and learning of PE; running 'Wake Up! Shake Up! Each morning; working with the Sports Leaders; and offering a range of competitive and non-competitive sport and other healthy activities to pupils at break times and after school. He will also be supporting teaching and learning around school.

In spite of the huge financial pressures we face I am grateful to our Governors for agreeing to fund some additional temporary teaching assistant hours at the end of last year. Following a selection process at the beginning of the school holiday Mrs Mappin and Mrs Walton were appointed. Mrs Holloway remains with us supporting teaching and learning in Y6 until she commences her maternity leave.

At the end of the last academic year Mrs Bridget Ambrose stepped down as a Governor. During her tenure she offered school a great deal of support and as part of a dedicated team of Governors, has played a key role in our journey and helping us to build our reputation as an inclusive school that welcomes and champions the rights and opportunities of all children, including the most vulnerable. During that time she has also been an active member of the PTFA and on the Committee too. We thank Mrs Ambrose sincerely for her dedication, commitment and continued support.

Lottery Grant

The PTFA has applied for a £10k lottery grant on our behalf to further enhance the new 'Oasis' outdoor learning area for learning, inclusion and community activities. We hope to find out soon whether it has been successful. It reflects our unceasing determination to make our school vibrant and exciting for our children.

Building Works

The Y6 classroom will be finished this week so that the children can finally move in. I thank them; my colleagues; the children; and all the parents and carers for the patience and understanding they have shown regarding the unavoidable delay. Once the classroom is ready, we will invite all the parents/carers in to have a look.

The Y6 classroom is not the only area to benefit from updating. Over the summer we have been busy making a number of significant alterations to further improve our school building. The hall has been completely redecorated; has a brand new electricity supply with more points; new brighter, more efficient and environmentally-friendly lighting; and a simple but fantastic new stage lighting system.

We have saved enough money from the build costs to have the entire floor in the School Hall stripped right back and treated over the next (October) holiday so that it will look brand new. This expensive procedure is long overdue and will complete the renovation of the School Hall.

The entrance to the Y5/6 cloakroom has also been redecorated and re-floored and has also had new efficient and energy-saving lighting set within its new suspended ceiling. We are awaiting new space-saving lockers, so that each child in Years 5 and 6 will have his/her own locker.







The electrics have also been updated in the Key Stage 2 classrooms (Years-3-6) as part of the works.

Outside you will see that the original foundation stone for the school has been saved, repositioned and re-set outside the Y6 classroom so that it is visible for everybody to see. You will also note that there are new railings around the ramp to the library and Y5/Y6 classrooms with new wooden planters along the front to add interest and improve the general look of this side of school.

Obviously there is still building equipment on the playground, though it is fenced off. Though supervised by staff, until works are complete and all equipment has been removed we would be grateful if parents/carers could help us by supervising their children closely at the beginning and end of the school day so that they do not go near or enter the building site. Thank you.



- Every school day in <u>every</u> year group is important
- Holidays in term-time can have an impact on children and their progress
- 98%+ attendance is the target (186+ days) this year
- Try to have no more than 4 days off in a year
- There are 175 non-school days for holidays and appointments (where there is flexibility)
- Good attenders tend to feel more happy and secure in school, and achieve well

Attendance in <u>every</u> year group is extremely important and time out during term time does have a negative impact on children's progress, achievement and sense of wellbeing and confidence. Sometimes parents/carers assume wrongly that term-time holidays for younger children have no impact, or do not matter as much as for older pupils. To underline the importance of high attendance the target is now 98%.







We understand that occasionally there are circumstances when a term-time absence is unavoidable and these situations will always be judged on a case-by-case basis, taking full account of the additional information parents/carers provide to demonstrate that there exceptional circumstances.


Statement to Live By
