## **Uniform Reminders**

### Footwear

Children are required to wear proper black school shoes in school every day. Trainers (including all black trainers) and high boots are not permitted. Children can wear them to and from school and at playtime but must have proper school shoes with them to wear during around school and during lessons.

### PE Uniform

Children must wear the correct school PE uniform on PE days. This can be the official uniform provided by one of our two uniform suppliers with the school logo or items sourced from other locations which are PLAIN and in the correct colours.

Items bought from places other than our official suppliers must be **completely plain**. We do not want 'designer' items e.g. Nike, Adidas, Puma etc. or items with any labels, pictures, sequins, slogans or any other embellishment. It is uniform and should be as plain and functional as possible.

Please note that the colours of the sweatshirt/hoodie is plain burgundy and the jogging pants are <u>light</u> grey.
