Bluebell Wood

As a community we have been invited to get involved with the 'Living with Nature' initiative in partnership with Bluebell Wood Hospice. The Bluebell Wood Children's Hospice is located in North Anston, Sheffield. It is a very special place which offers care and support to children with a shortened life expectancy, both in their own homes and at the hospice in North Sheffield. Bluebell Wood is a place filled with laughter and love. The hospice aims to give families the chance to relax, take a break and have fun - and they aim to support the whole family. It costs £3 million every year to offer this support. With no government funding, the hospice relies on charitable donations. We have been invited to support them by getting involved in a scheme to plant a new bluebell wood here in Hackenthorpe, at Dyke Vale Road.

You can join in by buying a bulb (or several bulbs) - at a cost of £1each. If you would like to support this worthy cause, all you need to do is send in your donation in an envelope marked clearly "Bluebell Wood". We will then contact the charity and order the bulbs. Representatives of our School Council will then join Ms Golland in planting the bulbs on behalf of our community, and your donations will be passed directly to the hospice. Thank you.

Medical Details

Occasionally children's Medical Conditions change during their time at school. <u>Asthma</u> is one of the conditions which we need to be aware of, especially during PE lessons. If your child is diagnosed as Asthmatic and requires an Inhaler during the day kindly contact your doctor for a spare which can be left in school (CLEARLY NAMED) in the class Inhaler box. **Parents should check their child's Inhaler regularly to ensure it is not empty.**

If your child has any Medical conditions that we need to be aware of details should be indicated in the Medical Section of the PUPIL INFORMATION SHEET which you will have recently received.

If details change during the year which could affect your child's education in any way (even just needing to go to the toilet more often) please inform the school office.

Thank you for your support – your child's welfare is important to us

PLEASE NOTE: Short Term medication (prescribed or non-prescribed) cannot be administered by school staff. Parents must come into school to give their child medicine if they need it during the school day. The only exception is for children who require LONG TERM or LIFE SAVING medication when a Health Care Plan will have been set up with the School Nurse. Children MUST NOT bring any form of medication (tablets or sachets) to take themselves.

Morning Arrival

In an effort to encourage 'Independence' in our Y3/Y4/Y5/Y6 children we ask that parents leave the playground as soon as possible <u>before</u> the morning bell – 8:50am – so that the children can line up in their relevant classes with their friends and make their own way into school. Members of staff are on duty in the playground every morning from 8:40am. On 'Wet Mornings' ALL CHILDREN should use Y5/Y6 entrance and meet in the School Hall where staff again will be in attendance from 8:40am. At 8:50am the children will go to their relevant classrooms

Firstly you have to complete the local authority form (Common Application Form) online or in paper form and secondly you also need to complete a Catholic school application (Additional Information Form). **Both** are required by a Catholic secondary school as part of their admission process.
