Lent 2020: Ash Wednesday Liturgy

Fr Paul is now responsible for the parishes of Our Lady and Lourdes (with St Anthony's) and St Theresa's which means that he also now supports the Catholic life of both St John Fisher and St Theresa's schools. This means that the schools have come together with Fr Paul in order to ensure that the Catholic of both will continue to be vibrant and that both will continue to have a rich calendar of Masses and services throughout the year.

Every effort has been made to avoid clashes but Ash Wednesday is one of those days where a clash is unavoidable. Last year Fr Paul said Mass at Our Lady of Lourdes to mark Ash Wednesday, but this year it is the turn of St Theresa's school to have a Mass.

Therefore to mark Ash Wednesday at SJF this year, we are working with Fr Paul to plan a special non-Eucharistic Ash Wednesday liturgy to begin our season of Lent.


The service will be led by the young people of Y6 and will take place at 9.30am on Wednesday 26th February 2020 in Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church.








NSPCC Visit
